How sensory data form cognition has been subject to extensive discussion from the past. The etymological meanings of the terms that denote 'to see/ look at' and 'to perceive' have been corresponding and complementary in most of the Indo-European languages including Sanskrit. Although some such terms were semantically restricted over time some others retained the breadth of meaning their Proto Indo-European roots had carried. The somatic activity of seeing/ looking at something and the cognitive activity of perceiving it share a series of terms where those denotative of 'visual perception' seem to be re-dominant. This paper concisely compares

selected Proto Indo-European roots and their derivatives in Indo-Germanic, Indo-Iranian and Indo-Aryan languages to recognize some interesting matches and mismatches in terms of phonetic composition and meaning. It also argues that in the context of Indian philosophy the terms that denote to see and to perceive are more strikingly corresponding than they do in other environments...
